# THE FACTS ON ACEH

Post Tsunami 26 December 2004



On December 26, an 9.0 magnitude quake, the strongest since 1964 has been followed by dozens of aftershocks, causing a giant tsunami wave that wiped off mostly the western coastal area of Nanggroe Aceh Darussalam and North Sumatra.

# THE FACTS ON NIAS

## Post Tsunami 26 December 2004



District: Sirombu

36 villages with total population 19.000 people

Villages damage : 13 villages

Sirombu Village (worst hit)

Refugees : 1085 people (239 family)

House damage : 239 houses

General Occupation : 80% Fishing 20% Others



# THE FACTS ON NIAS

## Post Tsunami 26 December 2004

---

- SIROMBU is a central place for food trading or market place.
- The Tsunami has caused the coast line to move inwards approx. 2 km.
- It also caused the bridge to be shifted 12m away from the original place. Sirombu, located at the centre, was hit by Tsunami from the SOUTH & WEST side of the sea.
- Post Emergency Relief stage, the disaster demolished most of the building (esp. non concrete houses) in the disaster area.



# THE FACTS ON NIAS

Post Earthquake 28 March 2005



All roads cracked,..  
Bridges lifted up,..  
Distributions effected,..  
Villagers easily run out of supplies

Just when the world seemed to have forgotten about the Tsunami,...

Close to midnight: Monday March 28, 2005 at 11:09:37 pm

an 8.7 magnitude earthquake rocked entire NIAS islands,  
hit everything down....



# THE FACTS ON NIAS

Post Earthquake 28 March 2005

Gunung Sitoli, the capital city  
Center of economy for the  
entire islands collapsed.



Fear of further disasters and after shocks, the villagers live in tents away from home with a very limited supplies. Now... so much need, so much help needed...

# THE FACTS ON NIAS

Post Earthquake 28 March 2005



- 647 died
- 6,687 Injured.
- 1,349 Churches, 42 Mosques, 1 Buddhist Temple collapsed.
- 230,360 IDP's (Internal Displace Persons)
- 207 Government's buildings, 741 schools and 89 bridges collapsed.
- 13,923 Houses collapsed.
- 23,606 Houses damaged.
- 137 Shop Houses collapsed.

# OUR RESPONSE TO ACEH AND NIAS



Our Response to the crisis is to invest in developing local capacity, communities, people who will be there when the relief helicopters are gone. External help is critical in this initial period but an internal solution has to be fashioned by Indonesians working with Indonesians. Our business expertise assures that aid money is spent efficiently and well accounted for.

## ACEH

- Psycho-social project in Masjid Raya District, NAD, with Asian Medical Student Association (AMSA) and Universitas Padjajaran, Bandung.
- Public Health project with AMSA and the community of Krueng Raya.
- Rebuilding the Mushola (mosque) in Krueng Raya.
- Continuing to find volunteer teachers for Aceh.

## NIAS

- Continuing the project: 239 units of Housing Complex including infrastructure, art center, etc.
- Continuing additional 6 houses for teachers.
- Continuing additional 2 houses for doctors.
- Continuing the fishing boat project.
- Rebuilding Sirombu Village
